^{*} It is important to also consider the horse that the child will be riding. The horse/rider combination must be appropriate and the combination must be a safe match. The disposition of a suitable child's mount should be quiet, gentle, and of a calm nature. The level of training of the horse should be appropriate for beginner riders. The size and body type of the horse should also be considered when picking an appropriate mount for a child. Ideally the horse should be small enough that the child's legs are positioned under the child's body and at least half way down the side of the horse.

* It is recommended that a youth score <u>at least a 2 in all</u> of the categories <u>and</u> a score of <u>3 or 4 in at least half</u> of the categories on the evaluation form before the child is <u>considered</u> to be a candidate to ride a horse.
