

Program Introduction:

The 4-H Earn-An-Animal program allows for 4-H members (ages 8-18) as of the current 4-H Year to earn funding towards a project animal. This program requires dedication from the youth and support from their guardians. Youth must apply, prove that they have adequate housing for the animals, as well as, research, choose and purchase their animal and supplies. Through the 4-H Earn-An-Animal Project, 4-H youth will learn planning, time management, organization, and record keeping skills.


The program limit is one award animal per species. Once a species is won, that youth is ineligible to apply for that species again. No Lease Animals.

Requirements for the Earn-An-Animal Project:

(Scholarship winners will not receive re-imbursement until they have met all the requirements and approval of the Earn-An-Animal Committee.)

- Complete a Written Application, Interview, and Farm Visit. Applications are due by January 21st. No late applications will be accepted.
- Attend the Earn-An-Animal Orientation with a parent/guardian
- Large Animals (Horses & Cattle) must be owned no more than six month before the application deadline and no later than March 1st, 2020.
- All other species must be owned no more than three months before the application deadline and no later than May 1st, 2020.
- Youth are not to purchase animals from their own family farm.
- Provide adequate housing, and nutrition for my animal(s)
- Keep accurate Earn-An-Animal records
- Attend 4-H or non-4-H species specific clinic (at least one local or regional events accepted)
- Show my animal at the Junior Livestock Show or at a 4-H Horse Show (Species specific see species requirements hand out)
- Show my animal at the Fonda Fair
- Display a sign at the Fonda Fair with your stall decorations denoting an Earn-An-Animal entry.
- Send a thank you note to the Fulton-Montgomery 4-H Earn-An-Animal Committee and sponsors which will be done at orientation.
- Sign and return the Earn-An-Animal contract. This will be distributed at orientation.
- Submit a copy of the Bill of Sale for full or partial Re-imbursement (depends on species scholarship amount)
- Earn-An-Animal Complete Records due Oct. 15 to the 4-H Office (Same due date as the 4-H Project Record Book)

Failure to meet these requirements could result in forfeiting your re-imbursement and the right to apply for Earn-An–Animal.

Fulton-Montgomery 4-H Earn-an-Animal Program Description

Purpose

The purpose of the 4-H Earn-An-Animal Project is to: 1) give youth the opportunity to get started with a 4-H livestock/agribusiness project, 2) purchase a quality animal, 3) learn business practices

Method

Youth receive grant money they will apply to the purchase price of an animal(s) that they will raise and show. The hands-on experience of this project allows youth to learn important life and science skills it takes to complete a 4-H livestock project. Species awarded in the 4-H Earn-an-Animal Program: Cattle, (beef and dairy), goats (dairy & meat), swine, sheep, horses, rabbits, cavies and poultry.

How does it work?

Any Fulton-Montgomery enrolled 4-H youth, ages 8-18, as of the current 4-H Year may apply for a 4-H Earn-an-Animal project animal/agribusiness grant. Unaffiliated youth must enroll in the Fulton-Montgomery 4-H program to be eligible to apply.

Youth must complete an application including a reference check, have a face-to-face interview (with the Earn-an-Animal Committee) and formally agree to the requirements of the 4-H Earnan-Animal project. Applications are due **January 21**st, **2020** and can be downloaded from the CCE Fulton-Montgomery website, or picked up from the 4-H office. Youth may only apply for one species per year. The limit is one award animal per species. Once a species is won, that youth is ineligible to apply for that species again.

How is this program possible?

Generous financial donations of area businesses and individual supporters of this 4-H program.

What is expected of the selected youth?

Youth are expected to be the primary caregiver for the award animal(s). Award animals must be exhibited at the Fonda Fair, the Jr. Livestock Show or a 4-H Horse Show (if applicable for the species – see species requirement handout). Contracts with the award winners will specify the details. Youth work with a mentor to find and purchase an animal, if they have not already purchased their animal prior to application. Upon completion of the project requirements (must include a copy of the bill of sale) and approval of the Earn-An-Animal committee, scholarship winners will be reimbursed for the agreed amount. In all cases, the family will be required to cover the initial purchase cost of the project animal.
