A Farm Brewery license is available to breweries when sufficient amounts of NY grown ingredients are used in making their beer. This legislation has created a demand for NY grown malting barley to meet the ingredient requirement for licensing. With the higher price malting barley can command comes a higher level of management and risk on the part of the grower. Identifying and Controlling Small Grain Diseases
