From NYS Thruway Exit 29 Canajoharie

Right on Rt. 5S west to Church St./Rt. 10 (.2 miles). Left on Church St./Rt. 10 to traffic light at intersection of Church St./Rt. 10 and Montgomery St. (.1 miles). Left on Montgomery St. to Maple Avenue (.2 miles). Right on Maple Ave through flashing yellow light to flashing red light at Burch St. (.3 miles).

For Elementary/Middle School complex turn left on Burch St. to school (.3 miles)

From North (Rt. 5 or Rt. 10)

Follow to stoplight in Palatine Bridge (intersection of Rt. 5 & Rt. 10). Rt. 10 south over river to traffic light at intersection of Church St./Rt. 10 and Montgomery St. (.4 miles). Left on Montgomery St. to Maple Avenue (.2 miles). Right on Maple Ave through flashing yellow light to flashing red light at Burch St. (.3 miles).

For Elementary/Middle School complex turn left on Burch St. to school (.3 miles)

From South (Rt. 10)

Follow Rt. 10 to 1st stoplight in Canajoharie (intersection of Church St./Rt. 10 & Montgomery St.). Right on Montgomery St. to Maple Avenue (.2 miles). Right on Maple Ave through flashing yellow light to flashing red light at Burch St. (.3 miles).

For Elementary/Middle School complex turn left on Burch St. to school (.3 miles) *From West (Rt. 5S)*

Follow Rt. 5S to 1st stoplight in Canajoharie (intersection of Main St./Rt. 5S & Church St./Rt. 10). Right on Church St./Rt. 10 to traffic light at intersection of Church St./Rt. 10 and Montgomery St. (.1 miles). Left on Montgomery St. to Maple Avenue (.2 miles). Right on Maple Ave through flashing yellow light to flashing red light at Burch St. (.3 miles).

For Elementary/Middle School complex turn left on Burch St. to school (.3 miles)

Criteria for Honor Club Designation at Fulton/Montgomery 4-H Member Recognition Program

- 4-H club set goals for the 4-H year and submitted a *Goals Poster Sheet* to the 4-H Office on or before <u>December 1st</u>.
- 4-H club evaluated its goals, documented and celebrated its accomplishments and submitted *Accomplishment Sheet* to the 4-H office by <u>October 15th</u>.
- The 4-H club organizational leader completed and submitted a *Member Project Data Sheet* showing all club members enrolled in and completing a minimum of one 4-H project for the past 4-H year by <u>October 15th</u>.
- 4-H club created, adopted and submitted a *Club Calendar* to the 4-H office on or before <u>December 1st</u>.

- 4-H club secretary submitted a minimum of 10 monthly *Secretary's Reports* to the 4-H office during the past 4-H year reflecting a well-rounded 4-H club program with regular business meetings, community service, project work and recreational activities.
- 4-H club audit committee completed internal club audit comparing the treasurer's record book, cash and bank account records covering the previous 4-H year and submitted a signed 4-H *Club Audit Report* to the 4-H office by <u>October 15th</u>. Also attached a 4-H *Club Financial Statement* for the same period signed by the club treasurer and organizational leader as well as the past year's treasurer's book.

New York Farm Bureau Offers Scholarships to Students who Plan an Ag-Related Future!

New York Farm Bureau is encouraging high school seniors who have been involved with agriculture and plan on continuing studies in this field to apply for the New York Farm Bureau Agricultural Youth Scholarship sponsored by the New York Farm Bureau Promotion and Education Committee.

Scholarship awards are \$1,500 for first place \$1,200 for second and \$1,000 for third place. The first place winner will be invited to present their essay at a NYFB Spring event. Students applying must have a family Farm Bureau membership or a Student Farm Bureau membership (a membership application may be included with scholarship enclosures).

Students are required to submit a brief essay answering the question, "If you had the power to change something in your community or on your farm, what would you change and why?" At the District level, a personal interview and essay presentation may be scheduled at the discretion of the District Representative.

The winner at the county level will be the applicant scoring the highest for each county. The District winner will be overall highest county winner. District winners will be notified on or

before the District judging deadline of January 18th 2013. The District winners will have an opportunity to make minor changes (i.e. grammar, spelling, additional awards etc.) to their applications prior to the February 1st final deadline, at which time all applications must be received by New York Farm Bureau for the state judging. The State competition is based solely upon the application and attachments. County Farm Bureaus are urged to utilize the talents of these young people for county events such as Earth Day and Ag Day Celebrations, special events, county Annual Meetings and Rural Urban Dinners. These young people are the future of Agriculture in NYS and a voice of hope and passion in this ever-changing environment we call home. Help empower them to spread the message.


4-H Interest Meeting: November 28th 6:30-8:00 p.m. @ Shirley Luck Senior Citizen Center
