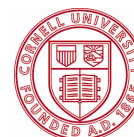

Classes are arranged sequentially, but can be attended independent of each other. Register for all four classes or select the session(s) you wish to attend.

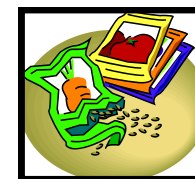
The cost of each session is \$5, or pay \$15 if you register for all 4 classes.
